

Knife Angel: Marketing Information

About Knife Angel

The Knife Angel is a stunning, 27ft tall sculpture of an angel made out of 100,000 knives, confiscated by the UK's 43 Police Forces. With the names of victims of knife crime inscribed by their loved ones, the Knife Angel is both a memorial and a symbol of hope for the future. As a National Monument Against Violence and Aggression, the Knife Angel exists to spearhead change and raise awareness about the impact of violent crime on communities, families and individuals.

Since its completion at [The British Ironwork Centre](#) in 2018, the Knife Angel has visited eleven towns and cities, from Gateshead to Rochester. Hosted at Hereford Cathedral, [the Knife Angel will visit Hereford](#) from June 14th – July 12th, 2021. During this time, Hereford will celebrate this educational opportunity by hosting a series of workshops and interactive events for young people, and a national conference for professionals. Aim of the conference

Knife crime and violent behaviour are fast becoming a national priority in Britain. *Crime in 2021: Knowledge to Practice* is bringing leading professionals together to explore both knife crime and crime more broadly. The key aim of this conference for professionals from the Hereford region and across the UK is to explore what we can learn from research and how we can translate research into practice.

Attendees will have the opportunity to hear from specialists, academics and practitioners, engage in Q&A sessions and enjoy break-time activities via breakout rooms. As such, we imagine this conference will appeal most to professionals working with young people or adults who may be affected by crime.
